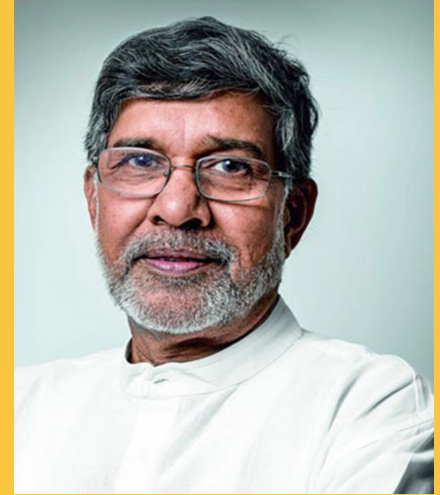

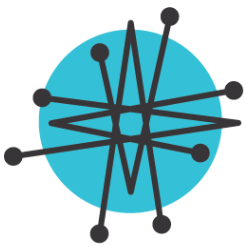

BE INSPIRED BY NOBEL PEACE LAUREATE KAILASH SATYARTHI



Kailash Satyarthi was born in the Vidisha district of Madhya Pradesh in India. After completing an electrical engineering degree, he worked as a teacher in the area. In 1980, he left teaching and founded the organization Bachpan Bachao Andolan, which has freed thousands of children from slave-like conditions. He has also been active in a wide range of other organizations working against child labor and for children's rights. Kailash Satyarthi is married and has a son and a daughter.

COMPONENTS OF A PEACEJAM CONFERENCE

Family Groups & Mentors

University students are trained to mentor younger students and lead small reflection groups where students debrief the social justice issues discussed during PeaceJam Conferences.

Service Projects & Workshops

Preparing students to be change-makers through high-quality volunteer projects and engaging workshops that teach 21st century skills.

The Jam

Students have the opportunity to experience the Nobel Laureate's culture through music, dance and performance.

Student Presentations

Students engage in service-learning curriculum and create projects for social good, and then share their projects and passions with the Nobel Laureate.

Ceremony of Inspiration

A powerful session where the Nobel Laureate shares what inspires them to continue their work in the face of very difficult challenges and then invites students to come on stage and share what inspires them.

One Billion Acts of Peace

A global citizens' campaign led by PeaceJam's 14 Laureates and students to engage the world to address the most pressing issues facing our planet. Students have the opportunity to present their project to the laureate.
