Betty Williams is a co-recipient with Mairead Corrigan of the Nobel Peace Prize in 1976 for her work as a cofounder of Community of Peace People, an organization dedicated to promoting a peaceful resolution to the Troubles in Northern Ireland.

PEACEJAM is an international organization led by 14 Nobel Peace Laureates committed to supporting youth-led projects that think globally and act locally. PeaceJam has programs in 39 countries, inspiring young people to address the 10 most pressing issues in the world.

What's a PeaceJam Conference?

A PeaceJam Youth Conference is a two-day Leadership Development event for teens led by a Nobel Peace Prize winner and mentored by university students. This fun, inspiring, conference allows youth to connect directly with an inspiring world leader for peace and social justice and showcase the work they're doing in their communities.

Secondary students interested in leadership development, understanding global issues, and creating change in their school or community.

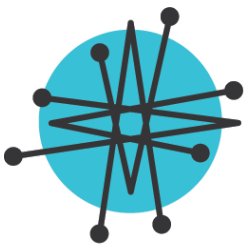

BE INSPIRED BY NOBEL PEACE LAUREATE BETTY WILLIAMS



Betty Williams won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1976 for her calls to end violence between extremist Protestants and Catholics in Northern Ireland. Williams was born in 1943 to a Protestant father and Catholic mother. Each side of the conflict killed one of her cousins, and her family endured violence for their religious tolerance. Williams witnessed the tragedy of a shooting near Belfast which killed three children and decided to protest the violence. Williams co-founded the Community of Peace People with Máiread Corrigan and became a grassroots activist who established local peace groups comprised of former opponents in the conflict.

Family Groups & Mentors

University-age youth leaders are trained to mentor younger students and lead small reflection groups where students debrief the social justice issues discussed during PeaceJam Conferences.

Service Projects

We will work side by side with the community to address true human security by ensuring equal access to healthy food for everyone and caring for our environment.

Student Presentations

Students engage in service-learning curriculum and create projects for social good, and then share their projects and passions with the Nobel Laureate.

Workshops

Partner organizations come to share their knowledge and expertise on an issue area that they are passionate about in an interactive and educational workshop experience.

Ceremony of Inspiration

A powerful session where the Nobel Laureate shares what inspires them to continue their work in the face of very difficult challenges and invites students to come on stage and share what inspires them.

One Billion Acts of Peace

A global citizens' campaign led by PeaceJam's 14 Laureates and students to engage the world to address the most pressing issues facing our planet. Students have the opportunity to present their service project to the laureate.
